### Transfer Networks (TN) – a bit of history

- Piloted under URBACT II (2007-2013)
- 23 TN & 7 TN 2<sup>nd</sup> Wave funded under
   URBACT III (2014-2020)

>>> 23 Good Practices transferred

to 163 cities

>>> 186 cities involved in total

#### **Good Practice City**

- Share the experience > <u>'mentor' role</u>
- Refine and improve its own practice
- Wider recognition of the potential for re-use and greater visibility

#### **Transfer Cities**


- Understand > adapt > reuse the good practice

- >>> Accessing financial resources for exchange and learning







### THE GOOD PRACTICE OF ATHIENOU

### Municipal Council of Volunteers (MCV) founded in 1970

- -Intergenerational governance structure of around 50 people (chaired by the Mayor)
- -People of all ages offer their time and services to those in need
- -Complementary to the municipal welfare services
- -It recognises the social needs and contributes to the development of necessary policies to address them.




# 1<sup>st</sup> TRANSFER NETWORK VOLUNTEERING CITIES (Dec 2018-mid 2021):

M4	Corporate Citizenship	Increase involvement of companies in volunteering through citizenship
01	Social Entrepreneurship	Tackle unemployment

### **Results:**


- 7 URBACT Local Groups created: one per partner


